# Growth at Every Stage

Steps supports students at every stage of their educational journey, providing targeted programs and resources from early childhood through college and career.



#### PRE-K TO 2ND GRADE

 Direct outreach to parents and caregivers to ensure access to resources such as early learning programs, childcare, household goods, and technology

#### 3RD TO 8TH GRADE

- In-school Advisors\*
- Outside of school: after-school programs, outdoor opportunities and summer camp support, and work readiness programs beginning in 7th grade





#### HIGH SCHOOL

- In-school Advisors\*
- Outside of school: career explorations and internship placements, college admissions and financial aid counseling, and leadership opportunities

#### **COLLEGE AND CAREER**

- 1-on-1 college advising, both virtual and in-person
- Workshops and networking opportunities
- Aid for textbooks, living expenses, and tuition bills
- Counseling on post-collegiate pathways



# Steps Alumni Paying It Forward




