In our 20 years, we have helped 5,000 students thrive academically through after-school enrichment, career readiness, and college success.



90% of our college students are on track to graduate in 4-6 years—five times the national average for low-income students!





to the workplace!




95% of our elementary/ middle school students show measurable growth in enrichment subject matter such as S.T.E.M. topics.
